Bobbie Jean Scott Hayden was born in Prairie View, TX. on September 30, 1945 to Helen R. Scott and Tories Scott, Sr. She was the first of their four children. Bobbie attended grade school in Hempstead, TX. She continued her education at Massey Business College and Prairie View A&M University.

Bobbie accepted Christ at an early age, uniting with St. Peters Baptist Church. After relocating later in life, she joined the Community of Faith Baptist Church under the leadership of Bishop James W. E. Dixon, II. She attended services at the COF until her health failed.

Over the course of her life, Bobby was employed at Prairie View A&M University, the Veteran's Administration Hospital in Houston, TX. and the Travis State School in Austin, TX.

Bobbie was united in marriage to Darwin Hunter and they were blessed with one child. She later married Tippie Hayden who preceded her in death. Her parents and two sisters, Gloria D. Hayden and Hilaria J. Bratton, also preceded her in death.
